Bible Readings:

Exodus 3: 1-15

This reading is among the 'golden' passages in the Hebrew Bible. The image of a burning bush is at the heart of the symbol chosen to represent the Presbyterian tradition – a people sensitive to the call of God, heard in silence and responded to in love and obedience.

Acts 17:22-29

Paul speaks to the Athenians of a presence, an energy, God, 'in whom we live and move and have our being.' We may spend our life in search of God but Paul assures his hearers that God who they seek is not far from each of us.
