Acts 11: 1-18

Peter assumes that some are to be accepted as among the people of God while others are to be regarded as beyond the reach of divine and human acceptance. Peter takes this popular view for granted until he has a vision that convinces him that no one is to be regarded as excluded from Godlove. He knows that from now he is to be a servant of this inclusive love that has touched him. To walk in expansive and inclusive love is to live within the Spirit of God.

Revelation 21: 1-6

John concludes his strange and visionary meditation with a vision intended to encourage those who yearn for a time when the power of those who oppress is no more, when weeping is no longer the dominant song of humanity, when water and food is shared, when God is known as love that wipes away tears, makes all things new and heals humanity from foolish and life denying divisions.
