


Eco Church NZ A couple of months ago St. Paul's agreed we'd like to become an Eco Church. For this to really take off, we need a

Personal Safety and Security

Why is it cold in church on Sunday?

The ongoing presence of covid and the winter flu in our community is a significant threat to all of us and the parish has an obligation to heed public health warnings to keep you safe. One of the key things we can do is ensure there is plenty of fresh air inside the building. This means keeping windows and doors open so that there is a flow of fresh air circulating. If you are using the lounge for a meeting, you should ensure fresh air is circulating – the air conditioning units don't bring in fresh air, they only recycle the air in the room hence the need to bring in fresh air. While we do have the heaters going, please feel free to bring a warm rug or blanket and wear warm clothing.
