

God of infinite and deepening love:

May the door of this church be wide enough to receive all who hunger for love, all who are lonely for friendship.

May the door of this church be narrow enough to shut out pettiness and pride, envy and enmity.

May its threshold be no stumbling block to young, or straying feet.

May this church be for all who enter, a doorway to richer and more meaningful life.

May the door of this church open to a community shaped by hospitality, strengthened in forgiveness and united in care for one another.

Reading 1: Psalm 100

This psalm has been a reminder to worshippers across the centuries that whether life be good to us or difficult, filled with joy or despair, we are embraced by God-love, a love that endures forever. It is the simple yet profound background to all that happens.

Reading 2: Matthew 6:24-34

At the heart of the Way pioneered by Jesus is an invitation to live simply, placing people before money, compassion before status, care for creation before personal wealth, love of peace before patriotic posturing. So simple – yet so difficult to pursue in our overly complicated, power seeking and confusing world.
