Eco Corner

Plastic that eats itself? Not a rubbish idea. The Times Scientists may have come up with a novel solution to the world's litter crisis: a plastic that eats itself.

The material is soft and flexible and has been designed to be used for things such as watch straps or the soles of trainers. However, it contains an unusual extra ingredient: dormant bacteria that will wake up and consume it once the plastic is discarded and buried...

Jon Pokorski, a professor at the University of California San Diego, who led the research said, "the cool part about this is that it improves the material properties...but at the end of life, regardless of where the plastic is disposed of, it will break down. <u>Child sponsorship collection, Sunday 24th November</u>.
