Eco Corner

Review by Danyl McLauchlan of "Not the End of the World" by Helen Ritchie, Data Scientist, in *The Listener*

- When many people think about sustainable economies, they think of pre-modern cultures: indigenous peoples in harmony with the land.
- Ritchie believes we've romanticised these societies in which half of all children died before adulthood and deadly famines were routine events. They were sustainable because disease and starvation kept the population-level in check.

A truly sustainable society is one that provides for the existing generation without passing the cost on to future generations via the destruction and, consumption of the environment they'll be living in.

In 1983, the United Nations created the World Commission on Environment and Development to study the connection between ecological health, economic development, and social equity. The commission, then run by former Norwegian prime minister Gro Harlem Brundtland, published a report in 1987 that has become the standard in defining sustainable development.

That report describes sustainable development, or the blueprint for attaining sustainability, as "meeting the needs of the present without compromising the ability of future generations to meet their own needs."
