Readings for Easter Day:

1 Corinthians 15: 1-11.

Paul apparently knew nothing of the parable of the empty Easter tomb but he sensed the presence of Jesus and the truth of the Way Jesus pioneered. It was as though Jesus was present among them even though they knew of his cruel death at the hands of Roman rulers. Roman law considered Jesus and his dreams of a new society to be finished. Paul and others asserted the hopes Jesus shared were just beginning.

Mark 16:1-8

Matthew, Luke and John conclude their Jesus books with colourful tales of an empty tomb and of encounters with Jesus who they knew had been crucified. Mark has a briefer tale to tell and it ends on a surprising note: those who were first aware of the continuing presence and possibility of Jesus fled for they were 'afraid.' So puzzled were the first readers of Mark at this unexpected remark that an expansion of the resurrection story was added later to bring Mark into line with the more expansive tales told by the other Gospel writers.
