## The Readings:

## 1 John 4:7-12.

No three Biblical words are more important and life transforming than the words "God is Love." With these words John goes to the heart of the Christian Way. In the Old Testament Jeremiah imagines God reassuring a broken and despairing people that they are 'loved with an everlasting love'. John keeps it simple yet profound: simply, "God is love." The ethical conclusion he draws is similarly simple yet

profound; "since we are held in God-love, we also ought to love one another."

#### John15: 9-17.

John's Gospel is sometimes described as "The Gospel of Love'. This passage certainly places love front and centre of the Way pioneered by Jesus. It seems that the over -arching purpose of Jesus, according to John, is to teach people to "love one another." So simple, so difficult, so necessary, so extraordinary, so uncommon. If we were to read further in John, we would be alerted to the strange fact that seeking a world shaped in love can cause some to distrust you – either to rubbish you as a starry -eyed idealist or as some sort of revolutionary wanting to reshape society. Strange but true. Jesus was killed by those who feared love, justice peace and change. He was killed but the Love goes on.

**Reflection:** 'God is love': living toward, a society shaped by practical love.

## \*Hymn: There's a wideness in God's mercy

But we make God's love too narrow by false limits of our own, and we magnify its strictness with a zeal God will not own.

For the love of God is broader

than the measures of the mind, and the heart of the Eternal is most wonderfully kind.

If our love were but more simple, we should rest upon God's word, and our lives would be illumined by the presence of our Lord.

## Offering:

God of heaven and earth, you make us one in Christ. Inspire us with new vision and the wisdom of ancient dreams. Give us strength to walk together as people of Christ, supporting each other on the journey and contributing to the well -being of the human family.

Christ is risen and goes before us into every part of life. We are surrounded by signs of Christ's presence. Christ is risen. *He is risen indeed.* 

There are people in every continent working for peace. They seek a world where human life can flourish and the sound of guns is silenced. Christ is risen. *He is risen indeed*.

In our land and in many lands people are learning to reach across barriers that divide and to befriend those of other faiths, cultures, histories. Christ is risen. *He is risen indeed.* 

In our own district there are people who feed the hungry, give shelter to the homeless, visit the prisoners, care for the vulnerable and offer friendship to the lonely.

Christ is risen. He is risen indeed.

Even as we pray, forgiveness is being offered and accepted, truth is being spoken to those who exploit their neighbours, the sick are being healed, the dying are being supported. Christ is risen. *He is risen indeed*.

God, present among us, whisper of a gentle breeze, insistent call to seek justice and to make peace, deep mystery that will not let us go, open our eyes to see you in the everyday, open our hearts to your truth and your love. In life and in death hold us within your risen love.
